

What Am I?

In a riddle poem, you have to work out what the poem is about. Here's an example:

*I am as wise as an owl
I work like a dog (well, 9am – 3.15pm...and then some more)
I talk all day to 30 mini versions of myself
I am in the same room as you
What am I?*

The answer is 'a teacher'. In a riddle poem you cannot say what you are! You just give clues. It's very useful to use **similes** in riddle poems (did you spot ours?).

Write a riddle poem either for a miner, a factory worker, the train or London (you can 'be' the train or London). It only has to be four lines long and must include at least one simile! It ends "What am I?".

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
